Last inspection: Not yet been inspected WHITMORE High School is the new mixed-sex secondary school occupying the building which was the all-boys (except for sixth form) Barry Comprehensive School which, itself before that, had been Barry Boys.

But with a new name and intake, new designs and plans are afoot for a complete new build with the aim of a September 2021 start.

Head teacher Andrew Thompson, previously the deputy head teacher, took the helm in September 2018.

Mr Thompson said: "The pupils and staff are involved in the design

with the aim of delivering an

outstanding 21st Century school. "Already many departments have met with the architects for important discussions on how the new building could further support teaching and learning in their

There have been many thrilling discussions around possibilities to develop the drama, music, art and ICT areas.

Many exciting additions planned for the new school include a large auditorium, a new canteen, new sport and multi-use games area, fully equipped science laboratories and technological areas, as well as up to date equipment for individual classrooms.

Mr Thompson said the school would deliver an outstanding education for Barry's young people, excelling in academic performance as well as the areas outside the classroom – artistic, sporting and creative development.

It would focus on developing confident and mature individuals who can go on to lead happy, fulfilling and successful lives

"The school is in the exciting era of establishing new partnership working with many existing and

other different links," he said. "The governing body of the school, and all of its subcommittees, are newly created and keen to support and develop the school.

"Close links have been established with our Primary feeder schools with many pupils and parents being able to visit in our October and July transition days.

"Senior leaders of the school have close working relationships with the schools' advisory service to ensure high standards are maintained.

Departmental leaders work closely together and with leaders from other schools to make certain learning is at the forefront of the

"The school continues to work closely with its social and support partners, who help pupils and their families in times of need and the school is proud to be the lead school for Wales in attaining an award for the work done with young carers.

Mr Thompson added: "I have

been particularly impressed this year with both the range of extra-curricular opportunities our staff have provided for pupils and the enthusiasm and commitment with which so many pupils have engaged

"Whether it is – to pick just a small selection – the drama club, Mandarin club, art academy, public speaking, or one of the many numerous musical groups and sporting activities, the school seems a hive of activity at all hours of the day.

"It is this richness of pupil development that we are striving for here at Whitmore - to offer opportunities the children cannot access outside of school and which help to shape them into responsible, mature and successful young adults.
"I have also been impressed with

the maturity and dedication all the students have shown in opening the new school as a co-ed (mixed) school; the girls who transferred from Bryn Hafren have settled in superbly well, and the boys should be equally congratulated for their mature start to the new school.

"We have many successes to celebrate: great performances and a winning team in the regional English Speaking Union's Public Speaking Competition; Cardiff and Vale Schools Five-a-side Football Champions for both Year 7 boys and Year 9/10 girls; multiple victories in rugby, including two resounding wins away at Millfield School in Somerset (u15s and u16s) and a hard-fought victory

in the inaugural Year 7 Barry derby against Pencoedtre High; school pantomime The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe, which showcased the huge talent across the school; an outstanding night of music from 'Year 7 and Friends'; as well as multiple successes for boys and girls - individually and as teams – across the many sporting disciplines.

'A real highlight for me has been seeing the growth in confidence and maturity of the pupils who attend our 'nurture group in the mornings as they settle into high school."
The new School Parliament

has been very active, raising key issues for the school community and pushing forward a new vision of charity for the school.

There have been deliveries of food hampers to local elderly residents, presents for poorly children through the LATCH charity, and the continuation of sixth form links to impoverished communities through its HelpLanka appeals and school trip – all organised by the pupils with invaluable assistance from staff.

The school raised hundreds of pounds for Children In Need in 2018 and school trips and visits have continued to supplement the curriculum, including local visits to Porthkerry park (DT), Vale of Glamorgan archives (history), the Gower Coast (geography), a day encouraging pupils' development of International Languages at Cardiff City, and its very active Duke Of Edinburgh team.

The school is a hive of creative and academic energy.
