# Assignment; Taking My Camera for a Walk!



## Task;

At this strange time your daily walk may be a very quiet one. This would give you the opportunity to notice details about your local environment that you may have missed before. It could hold some visually interesting sights along the way. Where you live is also part of your identity.

 Use the theme of "Taking My Camera for a Walk" to document your time outside your home.

Things to consider;

You could include your feet in your images

# Include close up photographs which show texture and pattern

Think about composition (the layout of your picture)

You may need to edit (crop, increase contrast, change brightness) your photos

- 1. Take your camera with you if you choose to go for a walk and capture sights along the way.
- 2. Up-load your images and save.
- 3. If you cant print and add this work to your sketchbook try making a PowerPoint portfolio instead.
- 4. Make a title page or use this work for your 'Environment' project we started before school finished.
- 5. Ensure you have found some initial images to create a mood board.
- 6. If it helps your thought process try to make a mind map of ideas before you head out with your camera.
- 7. Complete some analysis of images. If you can find a named photographer complete and artist page discussing their work using the artists analysis sheets you have.
- 8. Create a contact page with notes.
- 9. Choose a selection of your favourite images. Display these with some annotation about what you like about them.
- 10. Edit the best images which capture your journeys. There is no set limit but I would try to find at least 9 best images.
- 11. To work towards the higher grades of A/B edit images for than once each and discuss which edit is best and why. Make sure you include 'print screens' to discuss your editing process. There are some great free editing programs on the internet such as PixIr.


- 12. Display your favourite 9 edits as a set of images.
- 13. Print and stick all work into your sketchbook or produce a digital portfolio using PowerPoint.
- 14. Always include annotations on each page. Add comments such as Where were the photos taken? How did you take them? Could they be improved? How does the journey documented fit in with your identity?


