to be competed by Fri 19th June

1. Research & analyse 2 examples of pencil drawing of ‘personal objects’.
2. Produce 2 observational drawings of personal objects, inspired by your research of relevant artwork.

1. Research and analysis

1. Using the internet, research 2 examples pencil drawings featuring personal objects.
2. You can do this by using a search engine, and entering appropriate words such as 'pencil drawings of personal objects' or 'pencil drawings – personal still life' and so forth.
3. Save the images you choose and write about them using the 'How to analyse artists' work' & 'creative vocabulary' sheets, available on the 'art' learning section of the school website.
4. On the next slide there are some examples of the sort of image you could be looking for.

2. Produce 2 observational drawings of personal objects of your own.

- Select 2 objects to draw that represent you - they could be personal belongings, items relating to a hobby, or objects that you simply like.
- Produce a detailed drawing of each - you can use tonal pencil, biro, coloured pencil or whatever you have available.
- Consider the drawing process by starting to sketch the basic shape of the object, ensuring that the proportion and perspective is correct, before increasingly adding detail, then shading and texture. Make your work as life like and three dimensional as possible.
- On the next 2 slide there are images of pupils' work to inspire you.
