How to Structure Your Writing

Introduction - What is the name of the artist and what is the piece you are looking at called? When was it made? What do you first think when looking at this piece of work?

<u>Description</u> - What types of colours and shapes has the artist used? How would you describe the lines and textures in the image? How do you think the piece of work was made? What sort of techniques and media did the artist use.

Is there anything interesting or unusual that you notice about the work?

<u>Interpretation</u> – What do you think the meaning of the work is? Does this piece of work remind you of anything? If you were the artist, what would you call this piece of work?

Evaluation - What do you like the most about the piece of work? How does the piece relate to your work? What ideas could you use from this piece in your own work?

Example

I have created this piece using watercolours, coloured pencil and oil pastel. I have learnt how to blend the watercolours to show different tones and use oil pastels to show the darkest tones and add texture. The piece shows strong shapes and vivid colours. I have added coloured pencils to show some areas in more detail and focus. The artist Georgia O'Keeffe has inspired my piece. In her work she uses bright, bold colours to show close up views of flowers with a range of dark to light tones. I aim to now further develop my piece by using other materials. I could do this by experimenting with block prints on watercolour back grounds or possibly try painting onto fabric to then stitch into to show more detail.

- Produce one portrait every week until you have four completed.












Cardboard Portraiture

Year 7 Cardboard Portraits – look at the layers that have been created here.

• You need to start with a circular piece of card as your base approx. A4 squared. Then you need the head/face layer, neck, jumper/top, hair, eyes, nose, mouth, eyebrows, facial features – cheeks, glasses (?). Look how different types of card have used effectively. If you can't glue your work down. Perhaps you could carefully put it together and them photograph your work. This work should take 2 weeks to complete.
