

# Breaking news: Tree blocks path to school after Storm Enucie.



A nearby tree has collapsed near an entrance to Whitmore High School in Barry after the catastrophic events that happened on Friday 18th February with Storm Enucie. The incident occurred near Elan Close and has made it impossible for any pedestrians and students to pass through the area. On that day, the Met Office had originally issued a yellow weather warning, but after some consideration, they changed it to a red warning because of 100 mile an hour gusts that could occur because of Storm Enucie, meaning that it was a danger to life by going out. Luckily, because of the red weather

warning, nobody was in the school at the time, so that means no one was stuck there and unable to go home. This also means that nobody was injured either.

Storm Enucie has caused much damage to Barry and Wales. Fences, plants, slates, roofs and more have been blown away in the powerful gusts. People's belongings have flown away and houses have been damaged badly. Storm Enucie has been one of the worst storms in a decade, and has sadly caused severe damage and some deaths. The storm has also left many without power. On the day, you couldn't go on trains as they were worried the trains could be derailed.

When counting the rings on the stump, after the tree was taken down, you could see that it was around 90 years old and was an ash tree. The lifespan of an ash tree can be 200 -400. There seemed to be a lot of ivy and stuff growing on top, so it probably was top heavy and fell over. - Jack Oliver



## **Extra-curricular activities. Good or Bad?**

We interviewed Mr. Manley to get the scoop on extracurricular activities. Here's what he had to say...

He got the ideas for the clubs by teaching for so long in an all-boys school that when the schools mixed, he decided to make more activities for everyone to enjoy. So many students have different interests, so clubs give students a chance to try out new things. After school clubs are optional.

We asked Mr. Manley how he gets teachers to run the clubs, and this was his answer. He also plans to conduct a survey so pupils can choose what clubs they would want to be in, some future clubs Mr. Manley can see is golf, Music, Disco and Movie, these are all incredibly fun and exciting, there is so much more as well!

We decided to be different from other schools by having clubs such as weightlifting, endurance, tennis and table tennis with teachers who are trained in that area like Ms. Gisby who is trained in tennis and so on so forth.

Some of the clubs include art academy, basketball, coding club, weightlifting, football, netball, self-defense, yoga, tennis, and dance. The school provides a plethora of clubs that promote diversity and inclusion

We decided to do a lightning round with him. We asked him lots of questions and he had to answer them as fast as possible.

Do you have to pay to go to clubs? "No of course not we want clubs to be available for everyone" he said. How many clubs are there? "I would have to say around 25-30 Clubs are on at the moment." He spoke. Do you plan to keep expanding the clubs? "Yes, of course we do. We want students to be in clubs at least 1 day a week!" He said. Do you think any language clubs are possible? "Yes, we could have a Spanish, Welsh and French club. We actually used to have one." He said. Mr. Manley did well. He answered all our questions quickly!

Overall, we think that clubs are worth going to boost your confidence and increase your positivity. We think that after a long pandemic this will be good for your mental health and make new friends.


# What does Mr Robinson think of the snoopy ?




## What are Mr Robinsons ideas ?

## 8. Cavetown


